The Saint Paul Downtown Alliance is a nonprofit organization that represents downtown businesses, nonprofits, government entities, residents, and entrepreneurs.

MISSION

The mission of the Saint Paul Downtown Alliance is to create and maintain a vibrant, economically successful, safe, and attractive downtown that benefits the entire city and region by:

Downtown Investment Strategy

- The Saint Paul Downtown Alliance, in partnership with public and private stakeholders, created a Downtown Investment Strategy to dramatically increase density, vitality and desirability in downtown Saint Paul.
- Working collaboratively to achieve this vision, the Alliance and its partners are focusing efforts on three priority areas:
 - Converting under-utilized office space into housing
 - Investing in pedestrian-oriented streetscape improvements
 - Advancing downtown Saint Paul's most strategic redevelopment opportunities

A citywide cross-departmental approach to improving public safety

Focuses on addressing root causes of violence and disorder

Brings together enforcement, prevention, intervention, and actions that interrupt public health responses

Not a single program — a unifying strategy across city departments and external partners





Quality of Life refers to the overall well-being, safety, stability, and sense of belonging that individuals and communities experience in the City of Saint Paul.


Quality of Life is shaped by social, economic, and environmental factors — including access to safe and affordable housing, public safety, public health, economic opportunity, safe public spaces, and freedom from chronic disorder, violence, or victimization.

Quality of Life includes both **objective conditions** (crime rates, mental health crises, substance use disorder, housing stability, homelessness, environmental health) and **subjective experiences** (feelings of safety, trust in public institutions, and community cohesion).

Community Violence	Gun violence, group- related violence, retaliatory harm	Lead prevention and stabilization strategies (Project PEACE, Familiar Faces)	Targeted enforcement, intelligence, deterrence (SPPD)	Prosecution of violent offenses; civil tools to disrupt violence patterns
Public Disorder	Nuisance properties, drug houses, chronic calls for service	Support stabilization through Custom Coordination Table, community partnerships	Respond to disorder calls, partner with C1PS on chronic issues	Lead Nuisance Property program, civil enforcement

Property Risk Management Task Force: A Proven Model

- Focus: Risk management of failing downtown properties
- Cadence: Weekly interdepartmental coordination
- Key Outcomes:
 - Proactive inspections and stabilization
 - Ownership/receivership action through engagement
 - Tenant support and safety
- Lessons Learned:
 - Importance of cross-departmental response and coordination
 - Role clarity and action timelines
 - Transparent public updates

This grew and changed over the last 7 months. Staff now feel organized and supported.



Leveraging City Assets

- Strategy: Activate underutilized city-owned properties, increase private partnerships
 - Example: City Hall Annex redevelopment for housing and workspace improvement
- Actions:
 - Space needs analysis
 - RFP issuance and developer selection
 - Institutionalizing 'Team Downtown' co-location
 - ONS's downtown lease
 - Osborn370 9th floor lease
 - HRA-owned ramps, connecting with downtown businesses
 - Identify and program underutilized spaces
 - Impact: Increased tax base, long-term asset alignment, stronger downtown presence

Great work and will now be coordinated with other LOEs.



Public Realm Improvements

- Key Initiatives:
 - Repair sidewalks and lighting
 - Tree and vegetation upgrades
 - Street reconstruction
 - Pocket park enhancements
- Coordination Priorities:
 - Increased spending for sidewalks on key downtown sites
 - Align budgets, contracts, and timelines
 - Common "Investing in Saint Paul" banners at construction sites, with links to more information
 - Activate public spaces with partners
- Goal: Safe, green, inviting downtown

So many efforts are underway – utilize WG to align and maximize efficiency/impact.



Retain and Attract Businesses and Corporations

- Key Initiatives:
 - Intensive Business Outreach Program (priority)
 - Audit of current comms pieces and methods and coordinate/combine
 - Create a "How to" portfolio in conjunction with other departments
 - Create and maintain a "Pitch Deck" (new grocer example)
 - Work with DT Alliance and others to recruit businesses to empty retail spaces
 - Work with Greater MSP and others to recruit companies to downtown
 - Work with our parking ramp operators to offer group rates to office tenants
- Coordination Priorities:
 - C1PS efforts around shoplifting, other crime and QOL issues
- Goal: Through deep relationships with businesses, learn and understand business needs in real time / proactively in order to retain and attract businesses of all kinds.
