Results from Discussions with Councilmembers for the Affordable Housing Work Session June 2012

Draft Goal statement:

Goal statement: The Affordable Housing Trust Fund is designed to leverage additional resources to implement effective, ongoing programs to maintain affordable housing in the City of Saint Paul.

Priorities

- I. Three focus areas:
 - 1. Housing rehabilitation
 - 2. Keeping people in their homes
 - 3. New construction of affordable housing
- II. Effective, timely and sustained funding that grows and is flexible to address critical housing needs and maximize existing resources.

Outcomes:

- Eliminate vacant buildings by rehabbing and reoccupying them with owners/tenants
- Provide support to preserve the existing affordable housing stock
 - Financing assistance for capital improvements or major rehabilitation (e.g. assistance to fixed income condo owners)
 - o Maintaining occupancy in foreclosure situations (e.g., the Boston model)
- Revitalize and/or reinvent neighborhoods for ongoing vitality
 - o Change duplexes from investment properties to owner-occupied dwellings
 - Target homes in neighborhoods that can spur ongoing revitalization or maintain healthy neighborhoods (address the single vacant home on a street that has the potential to bring about neighborhood decline)
- Training to achieve better rental and homeownership outcomes
 - Provide professional tenant screening and training for tenants to be successful tenants
 - o Provide incentives to attract 'good' landlords
 - Create fund for qualified landlords to improve properties
- Alternative ownership models
 - Shared equity
 - o Rent to own
 - Expand Habitat for Humanity-like programs
 - o Boston model for foreclosures
