Revocation of Fire Certificate of Occupancy and Order to Vacate

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on February 2, 2018, for the renewal of the Certificate of Occupancy. Since you have failed to comply with the applicable requirements, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy in accordance with Section 40.06 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code.

A reinspection will be made on March 5, 2018 at 3:00pm or the property vacated.

The Saint Paul Legislative Code further provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. Failure to immediately complete the following deficiency list or the building vacated may result in a criminal citation.

DEFICIENCY LIST

1. Class - SPLC 40.04 (5) - The owner of a building used for residential occupancy who is applying for their FIRST Fire Certificate of Occupancy, must complete the Department of Safety and Inspection Landlord 101 course, or other landlord training program approved by the Department of Safety and Inspections. The training must have occurred within the last two years and the owner must submit a certificate of attendance or provide verification of enrollment in the next scheduled class to the Fire Inspection Division-DSI. This requirement shall not apply to an owner who has held a Fire Certificate of Occupancy on another residential property in Saint Paul prior to April 30, 2009. Owners have a full calendar year to complete either class.

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- 2. Exterior Garage SPLC 34.08(5), 34.32(3) All accessory structures including, but not limited to, detached garages, sheds and fences shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair. Provide and maintain exterior unprotected surfaces painted or protected from the elements.-Scrape and paint chipped and peeling areas of garage. Repair garage entry door.
- 3. Exterior SPLC 34.33 (3) Repair and maintain the door in good condition.-Repair or remove closer on front storm door.
- 4. Exterior SPLC 34.09 (4), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the door latch.-Repair front storm door latch.
- 5. Exterior SPLC 34.09 (4), 34.33 (3) -Provide or repair and maintain the window screen.
- 6. Exterior SPLC 34.08 (3) Provide and maintain suitable ground cover on all exterior areas to control erosion.
- 7. Interior Basement MMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter and installed in accordance with the mechanical code. This work will require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.-Have a licensed contractor pull a permit and provide a code compliant dryer vent.
- 8. Interior Basement SPLC 34.14 (3), MPC 4714.01 (T) Provide and maintain a window or approved ventilation system in all bathrooms.-Have a licensed contractor pull a permit and provide a code compliant vent fan or remove toilet.
- 9. Interior Basement Stairs SPLC 34.10 (3) 34.34(2) Provide an approved guardrail. Intermediate balustrade must not be more than 6 inches apart. Intermediate rails must be provided if the height of the platform is more than 30 inches.-
- 10. Interior Basement Stairs SPLC 34.10 (3), 34.34(2) Provide an approved handrail. The top of the handrail must be between 34 and 38 inches above the treads and run the entire length of the stair.
- 11. Interior Throughout MSFC 803.1 Wall and/or ceiling finishes exceed the code requirements for flame spread ratings. Remove or provide documentation of flame spread compliance.-Remove blankets from windows.
- 12. Interior Throughout SPLC 34.12 (2), SPLC 34.36 (1) Repair and maintain all required and supplied equipment in an operative and safe condition to properly and safely perform their intended function in accordance with the provisions of the applicable code. Replace missing and damaged door handles.
- 13. Interior Throughout MSFC 605.1- All light fixtures shall be maintained with protective globes if originally equipped.

- 14. Interior SPLC 34.09 (4), 34.33 (3) Repair and maintain the window glass.-Repair broken glass on front door.
- 15. Interior MN Stat. 299F.362 Immediately provide and maintain a smoke detector located outside each sleeping area.-No working smoke detectors in home. 24 hour reinspection.
- 16. Interior MN State Statute 299F.50 Immediately provide and maintain an approved Carbon Monoxide Alarm in a location within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Installation shall be in accordance with manufacturers instructions.-No CO detectors in home. 24 hour re-inspection.
- 17. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.

You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer.
