

WHAT IS IT?

 The Saint Paul Early Childhood Initiative is a Program designed to provide access to early care and education for Saint Paul's earliest learners, birth through kindergarten entry.

WHY IS IT NEEDED?

- Current funding sources do not meet the needs of children and families in Saint Paul, as nearly 80% live under 200% of the federal poverty level and are unable to access early care and education opportunities.
- Current program offerings spanning birth through kindergarten entry are limited in reach due to design.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

THE FUNDS

- Program funds would be derived from a special levy on property taxes.
- Based on 2025 projections, the estimated tax for a median income home of \$275k is \$15.91.

PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

- The Program would be governed by the Office of Financial Empowerment (OFE), who also governs and administers College Bound Saint Paul.
- Having full oversight of programming, OFE would contract for supports in the initial stages.
- An Early Childhood Advisory Commission comprised of community members would advise OFE on Program matters.

SERVICE DELIVERY

- Program funds would be available to Saint Paul residents and usable at licensed and legal non licensed centers and family providers having a business in Saint Paul.
- Family, Friend, and Neighbor providers would benefit from greater access to City programs and partnerships.

ELIGIBILITY AND SCALE

- All families living in Saint Paul are eligible to participate.
- More than 4042 children are estimated to participate in the first 10 years of the Program.
- The initial year of the Program will serve infants followed by toddlers and preschoolers in the second and third year.

UNIQUE PROGRAM FEATURES

- Program funding would be available for any scheduling option from part-time up to and including year-round, full- and extended day care.
- Participating providers would have access to Saint Paul specific professional learning experiences, licensing help, and an Early Childhood Resource Library.

WORKFORCE

 In collaboration with partners, providers would be supported with access to education and training opportunities, as well as licensing and entrepreneurial assistance.
