As owner or person(s) responsible for 42 ST ALBANS ST S: please eliminate the nuisance conditions which are in violation of Chapter 45 of Saint Paul Legislative Code.

1.Cut and remove any overgrown vegetation (including trees) impeding public right of way, sidewalk, blvd, and alley areas. Public sidewalks must be cleared edge-to-edge and up to seven (7) feet in height. Alleys and streets must be cleared from edge-to-edge and up to fourteen (14) feet in height.

PLEASE CUT AND REMOVE ALL PLANT GROWTH AND VEGETATION HANGING OVER ANY PORTION OF THE CITY SIDEWALK ALONG GRAND AVE. THANK YOU. Comply before September 17, 2024

If you do not correct the nuisance or file an appeal before September 17, 2024, the City will correct the nuisance and charge all cost, including boarding costs, against the property as a special assessment to be collected in the same way as property taxes. Charges: If the City corrects the nuisance, the charges will include the cost of correction, inspection, travel time, equipment, etc. The rate will be approximately \$260 per hour plus expenses for abatement.

APPEALS: You may appeal this order and obtain a hearing before the Legislative Hearing Officer by completing an appeal application before the deadline noted above or seven (7) days after the date mailed, whichever comes first. No appeals may be filed after that date. You may obtain an appeal application from the City Clerk's Office, Room 310 City Hall, 15 W. Kellogg Blvd., St. Paul, MN 55102. (651) 266-8585. You must submit a copy of this Order with your appeal application.

WARNING: If violations are not corrected by the compliance date, the city's costs will be assessed to the property taxes of the related property. If additional new violations are discovered within the next 12 months, additional charge may apply.
