## Case Narrative

The fire department was called to the report of smoke in a residence at 496 North Street. Firefighters arrived and found the neighboring address, 594 Brunson Street, a vacant duplex, actively involved in fire.

Individuals on scene reported smelling smoke in their own home at 496 North Street. After going outside to investigate the source, the witnesses observed smoke coming from the vacant duplex next door.

The investigation revealed that a fire occurred in the vacant residence at 594 Brunson Street. Due to defensive fire operations that lasted more than six hours, examination was significantly limited. Mass loss indicated that the fire originated in the first-floor kitchen area, which was under construction, and quickly extended to the second story. Because of safety and collapse concerns, documentation was confined to portions of the structure that could be safely accessed. Investigators also remained on scene during teardown to obtain additional views of previously undocumented sections.

Investigation also reveals that the property has been vacant for multiple years and had a deadline of September 15th to teardown or alter the structure.
