Courses cover a large gamut of topics from finance and accounting to management and leadership classes. You can learn better speaking skills and how to improve your Power Point presentations. You can sharpen your writing skills or learn to deal with conflict. And you can get some helpful insights into customer service.

Depending on the course, it may last four hours or a whole day. The utility has two seats available in each of the classes it is offering. Some series courses, such

Classes are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. You must obtain management approval prior to signing up for the course(s) you are interested in.
