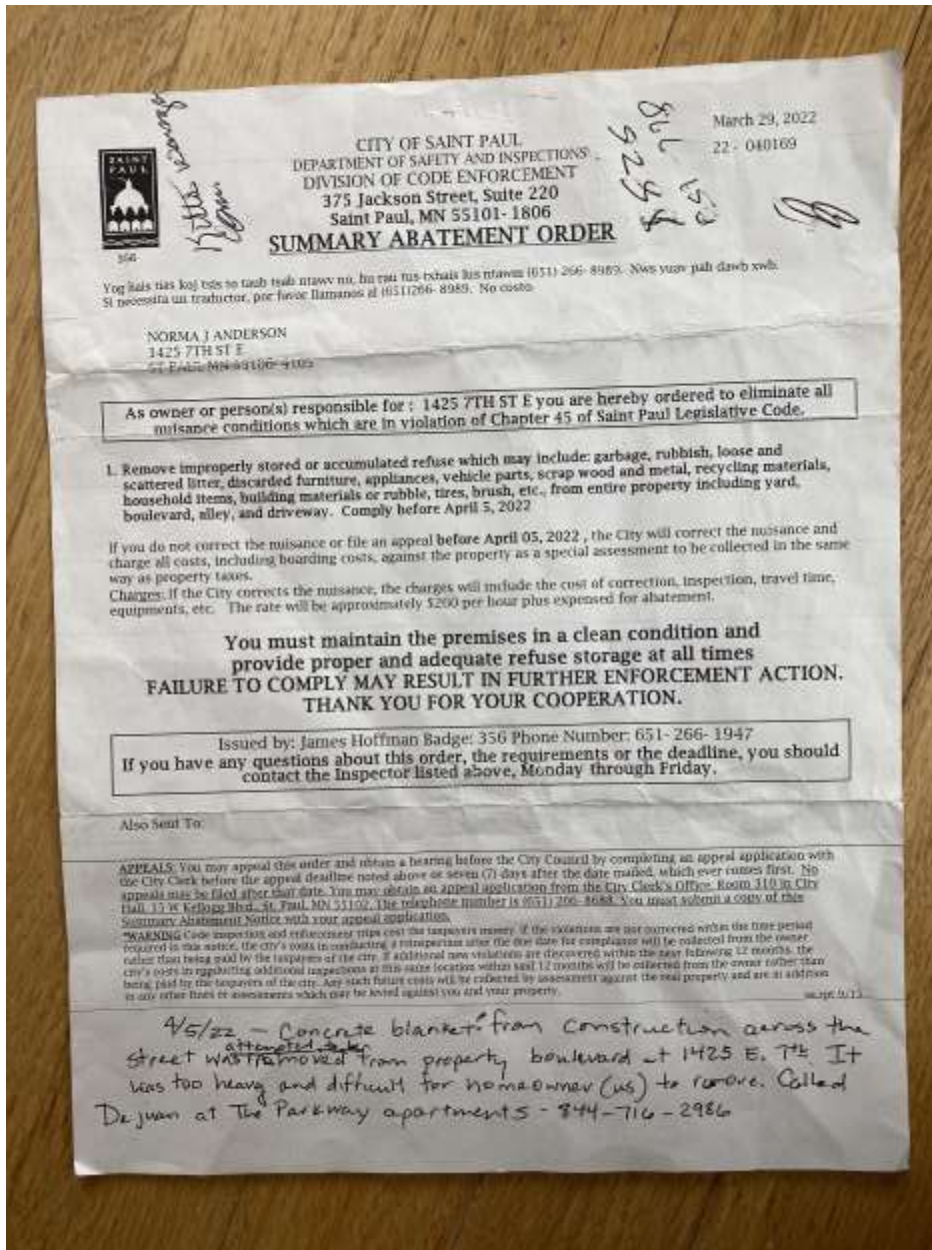
Here is further information regarding the summary abatement order.

The full garbage can in the yard was set by the curb and emptied.

The picture here is a concrete blanket on the boulevard in front of my mom's house. These objects are used to insulate concrete when it is poured during cold weather and are typically 4 foot by 20 foot according to my brother. It is very heavy and he was unable to move it. I have been in conversations with the manager of The Parkway apartments that were built across the street. My mom had workers and construction equipment occupying 7th street and Birmingham street for months during its building.

There is also curb and gutter being done there and I called that construction company as well (sign picture). While they said they would send someone over to pick it up, that was last Friday and was not done as of Saturday night, April 16, 2022.

As owner or person(s) responsible for : 1425 7TH ST E you are hereby ordered to eliminate all nuisance conditions which are in violation of Chapter 45 of Saint Paul Legislative Code.

1. Remove improperly stored or accumulated refuse which may include: garbage, rubbish, loose and scattered litter, discarded furniture, appliances, vehicle parts, scrap wood and metal, recycling materials, household items, building materials or rubble, tires, brush, etc., from entire property including yard, boulevard, alley, and driveway. Comply before April 5, 2022

If you do not correct the nuisance or file an appeal before April 05, 2022, the City will correct the nuisance and charge all costs, including boarding costs, against the property as a special assessment to be collected in the same way as property taxes.

Charges: If the City corrects the nuisance, the charges will include the cost of correction, inspection, travel time, equipments, etc. The rate will be approximately \$200 per hour plus expensed for abatement.

**You must maintain the premises in a clean condition and provide proper and adequate refuse storage at all times**

**APPEALS:** You may appeal this order and obtain a hearing before the City Council by completing an appeal application with the City Clerk before the appeal deadline noted above or seven (7) days after the date mailed, whichever comes first. No appeal may be filed after that date. You may obtain an appeal application from the City Clerk's Office, Room 110 in City Hall, 15 W Kellogg Blvd., St. Paul, MN 55102. The telephone number is (651) 266-8688. You must submit a copy of this Summary Abatement Notice with your appeal application.

**WARNING:** Code inspectors and enforcement staff cost the taxpayer's money. If the violations are not corrected within the time period outlined in this notice, the city's costs in conducting a reinspection after the due date for compliance will be collected from the owner rather than being paid by the taxpayer of the city.
