Dear Councilmembers,

My comments relate to Ordinance 22-44, setting the 2023 Garbage Collection rates.

You are likely aware of the low utilization of the base-level bulky item service, which residents were charge approximately \$2.1 million with taxes (2021). I recommend that the 2023 charges for base-level bulky service reflect past years' usage.

Citywide, participating households disposed 16,881 bulk items in 2019 and 21,123 in 2020, which is an average disposal cost of \$125 per bulkie in 2019 and \$100 in 2020. Households disposing more than their base-level number of bulkies pay \$10 to \$35 for each additional item, excluding the 37.75% in taxes.¹

Assuming 25,000 bulky items are disposed at a median cost per item of \$20, the base-level bulky costs would be \$500,000. The total cost is \$688,750 with taxes.

You could reduce the 2023 rates by \$1.4 million under these assumptions.
