Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on January 26, 2011 for the renewal of your Fire Certificate of Occupancy. Approval for occupancy will be granted upon compliance with the following deficiency list. The items on the list must be corrected prior to the re-inspection date. A reinspection will be made on February 23, 2011 at 10:00 AM.

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or the revocation of the Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building shall be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional reinspection fees.

YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR NOTIFYING TENANTS IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING LIST OF DEFICIENCIES ARE THEIR RESPONSIBILITY.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. 447 basement steps SPLC 34.10 (3), 34.33(2) Repair or replace the unsafe stairway in an approved manner.-Repair or replace dilapidated floor coverings.
- 2. 447 Basement MSFC 605.5.3 Immediately, discontinue use of frayed, deteriorated, damaged or spliced electrical cords.-Discontinue use of temporary decorative lighting.
- 3. 447 Basement NEC 110-26 Provide and maintain a minimum of 36 inches clearance in front of all electrical panels.

4. Kry

447 - Basement - MSFC 605.1 - Repair or replace damaged electrical fixtures. This work may require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090.- Secure light fixture at the bottom of the basement steps.

- 5. 447 and 443 Basement steps SPLC 34.10 (3) 34.33(2) Provide an approved guardrail. Intermediate ballustrade must not be more than 4 inches apart. Intermediate rails must be provided if the height of the platform is more than 30 inches.
- 6. Double hung windows MSFC1026.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. The minimum size must be 5 square feet of glazed area with a minimum of 24 inches of openable height and 20 inches of openable width. With a finished sill height not more than 48 inches. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651)- 266-9090. Refer to the Escape Windows for Residential Occupancies handout for more information.-

Refrigerators - NEC 440.13 - For cord-connected equipment such as room air conditioners, household refrigerators and freezers, drinking water coolers, and beverage dispensers, a separable connector or an attachment plug and receptacle shall be permitted to serve as the disconnecting means. The appliance must plug directly into a permanent outlet.-Currently-plugged in with adapter.

- Throughout Kitchen stoves MFGC 409.5 Provide an approved gas shut off valve within 6 feet of the appliance in accordance with the mechanical code. This work requires a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.
- 9. Throughout MSFC 901.6 Provide required annual maintenance of the fire extinguishers by a qualified person and tag the fire extinguishers with the date of service.
- 10. Throughout SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window in good condition.-Provide handles for the windows.
- 11. Throughout MSFC 104.9, 1005.3.2.2 Remove the storage under the stairs or provide and maintain 1 hour fire resistive construction on the storage side of the stairs.

- Throughout UMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter. This work may require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.- Remove unapproved duct tape on the dryer vent.
- 13. Throughout MSFC 605.4 Discontinue use of all multi-plug adapters.
- 14. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the provided smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
