**NARRATIVE**

On 4/24/2020 I was requested by SGT TINA KILL to go to 1541 Maryland Avenue to collect video for this incident. Please see my previous supplement.

It should be noted when I went in to collect the video the DVR was stored in the office area back behind the counter. The DVR was approximately 16 feet up in the ceiling. I asked an employee to get me a ladder since I could not reach it to put the flash drive in it. They gave me a ladder that was approximately 5 feet tall to stand on. While using the ladder I was reaching to try to put in the flash drive into the USB slot, but I still could not reach it. I pulled the DVR down from the rafter it was on and it hung there by the co-axial cables that it was attached to. This allowed it to be closer to me so I could reach the USB port. I downloaded the video that I needed and once I was done I tried to push the DVR back up onto the rafter it was originally on. I could not reach high enough to get it back up to it's resting spot, even while using the ladder they provided. I told the manager that gave me access to the DVR that I could not reach and asked if he could help me out. He responded with "I will take care of it, don't worry about it." I then left.

It should be noted that the business has 12 working cameras attached to the DVR meaning that there were 12 separate co ax cables attached to the DVR.
