## SERVICE AVAILABILITY PROCESSING FEE RECOVERY FEE EVALUATION

The Department of Safety and Inspection has reviewed the Service Availability Processing Fee which has been assigned to each Service Availability Charge (SAC) due at the time of building permit issuance. The SAC fee is the fee established by the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES) for each type of use on a property and associated discharge that the MCES will have to maintain the processing infrastructure including the sewage treatment plant. This collection of this charge is mandated by the Metropolitan Council to the municipalities in the seven county metropolitan areas for collection. At the beginning of 2010 the Department of Safety and Inspection (DSI) assumed responsibility for all the collection, recording and audit resolution functions for the City of Saint Paul. These functions were previously performed by the Department of Public Works, the Office of Financial Services and DSI. It became apparent the functions should be performed by DSI for consistency and efficiency.

In February of 2010, the processing fee was established in DSI as a cost recovery effort. In DSI's review of this process and its costs, DSI determined that the fee should be imposed per application rather than according to the number of SAC units in a given project. Further, DSI determined that the costs associated with each application fall into three Tiers which reflect the cost to DSI to process an application. Attached is the analysis of the time per application and the associated staff costs..
