SPRWS to host Drinking Water Institute July 29-31

The water utility is hosting the Drinking Water Institute for Educators from July 29 - 31 in the administration cafeteria, closing it to use for water utility staff.

The three day workshop is designed to educate teachers on our most important resource: water.

Twenty-six school teachers from across the state will converge on the cafeteria to not only learn about water and the challenges in producing safe drinking water, but they will develop curriculum to take back to their classrooms to teach their students about water.

"We are very excited to host this important event at SPRWS. It offers an opportunity to showcase our facilities, initiatives, and staff," said Racquel Vaske, general manager.

Several utility staff will be speaking as subject matter experts on water during the three-day event.

Vaske will provide a welcome and overview of the organization and serve on a panel.

Kirill Maloylo, assistant distribution division manager, will conduct a tour of a lead service line replacement site that is part of the Lead Free SPRWS program.

Staff are encouraged to use the administration commons area for breaks and lunch during the three-day program.

The workshop will run from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. each day from Monday to Wednesday.

"We appreciate everyone accommodating this workshop and providing the space for it to take place," said Vaske.

The cafeteria will be open for staff again starting on Thursday, August 1.
