This is to explain our reasons for appealing the registration of our building at 572-574 Ottawa Av. as a vacant building.

This duplex, which we've owned and managed for over 20 years, was vandalized by thieves who removed copper piping from the building, thereby disabling the plumbing and heating systems.

Prior to this criminal event, our building had been occupied continuously for over 2 decades, with an uninterrupted certificate of occupancy. Although both apartments had coincidentally turned over at the same time, and were therefore not occupied at the time of the copper theft, one of the apartments had only emptied approximately 2 weeks earlier, and the other was scheduled to be re-occupied the same morning the theft was discovered.

Our building had never been vacant, except in the way every building occupied by tenants becomes briefly empty while one tenant moves and another is chosen to move in.

The damages inflicted by the thieves are quickly repairable. We have obtained several estimates from mechanical contractors, and, once we choose a contractor, their remedial work can be completed in only a few days, thereby allowing the building to be reoccupied promptly.

BY registering this building as a vacant building, we need to incur the cost, and needless delays of weeks or months, to have all city building inspectors inspect this building initially and then re-inspect it before we can rent it to residents. We note again that the only damage needing repairs is the criminal theft of copper piping, which corrective work would routinely be done by a licensed contractor, and inspected routinely by one plumbing inspector and one heating inspector.


Allowing this needless registration of 572-574 Ottawa as a vacant building to continue will add unnecessary cost and workload to city inspections staff, already overburdened and many weeks behind in their obligations, and will condemn our building to extra months of vacancy, when it could easily be fully repaired and occupied within a few weeks if removed from the vacant building list.

VACANT BUILDING REGISTRATION NOTICE

You are also required to pay the annual Vacant Building Registration Fee of \$1,100.00 The fee is due upon receipt of this letter and must be paid no later than thirty (30) days from the date of this letter, as required in Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43. If this building is vacant due to a fire, complete the enclosed registration form and return it to this office within 30 days.

You may file an appeal to this fee or registration requirements by contacting the Office of the City Clerk at (651) 266-8688. Any appeal of this fee must be made within ten (10) days of the date of this notice.

If the registration fee is not received in this office within 45 days of the date of this letter the full amount owed will be assessed to, and collected with, the taxes for this property as permitted by Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43.

The Code Enforcement Officer has notified the Building Inspection And Design Section that this property meets the legal definition of a registered vacant building and in accordance with Legislative Code Chapter 33, no permits (except demolition, wrecking and removal permits) will be issued until the requirements of all applicable ordinances are fulfilled.

All category 2 and category 3 vacant buildings must be winterized with gas and water services shut off or, alternately, an excess flow gas valve must be installed in the dwelling, within sixty (60) days of the date of this Notice.

WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL IS REQUIRED BEFORE A CATEGORY 2 OR CATEGORY 3 VACANT BUILDING CAN BE OCCUPIED OR SOLD.

- Category 2: Requirements include: 1. register/re-register the building, 2. pay outstanding fee(s), 3. obtain a code compliance report, 4. submit for approval a rehab cost estimate from a licensed contractor and a schedule for completion of all code compliance work, 5. submit proof of financial responsibility acceptable to the City, and 6. obtain Zoning approval of the proposed use.
- Category 3: All requirements listed for Category 2 vacant buildings, AND obtain a Certificate of Occupancy OR Certificate of Code Compliance prior to the sale of the building.

If the use of this building meets the definition of a nonconforming use by the Zoning Code then the use will lose its nonconforming status 365 days from the date the building was declared vacant.

You must contact the Enforcement officer, Dennis Senty, at 651-266-1930 to find out what must be done before this building can be legally reoccupied.

The Enforcement Officer may declare this building(s) to constitute a Nuisance Building subject to demolition and issue an Order to Abate under authority of Legislative Code Chapter 45. In the event this building is declared a Nuisance Building subject to demolition, the Enforcement Officer will notify all owners and interested parties of the Order to Abate, as provided in the Legislative Code Chapter 45.

Your building was found to be unsafe, unfit for human habitation, a public nuisance, a hazard to the public welfare or otherwise dangerous to human life on April 27, 2011. A Condemnation Placard has been posted on the building.

CONDEMNATION OF THE BUILDING REVOKES THE CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

Failure to complete the corrections may result in a criminal citation. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- Condemned No Water Service SPLC 34.23, MSFC 110.1 This occupancy is condemned as unfit for human habitation. This occupancy must not be used until reinspected and approved by this office.-Immediately restore water service to the property.
- 2. Throughout SPLC 34.11(4), 34.34(1) SPC 4715.0200A Provide an adequate water supply to all water closets, sinks, showers and tubs.-All copper has been removed from the property. Replace the missing plumbing lines. All work must be done by licensed contractor under permit.

- 3. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 4. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the provided smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.

Written permission from the City of Saint Paul is required before a Category 2 or Category 3 Vacant Building can be sold. Requirements that must be met for <u>Category 2</u> vacant buildings include: 1. register/re-register the building, 2. Pay outstanding fees, 3. obtain a code compliance report, 4. submit for approval a rehab cost estimate from a licensed contractor and a schedule for completion of all code compliance work, 5. submit proof of financial responsibility acceptable to the City, and 6. obtain Zoning approval of the proposed use. <u>In addition to meeting all 6(six) of these requirements a Category 3</u> vacant building must obtain a Certificate of Occupancy or a Certificate of Code Compliance prior to the sale of the building.



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

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
