



Louis and Maud Hill began building their home in 1902, with the first section completed in 1906.

The front section was added in 1912. This consists of the entrance hall, four retreatant rooms on the first floor, a ball-room - now the chapel - on second floor, and a swimming pool - now the conference room - in the basement.

At the head of the stairs, on the wall outside the chapel, is a wooden Japanese screen which hides organ pipes.

In the library and dining room, Honduran mahogany is used extensively. The fireplace and library table are carved alike. The ceiling is a sculptured plaster of a design copied from a castle in Europe.

Of special interest in the solarium are the Tiffany stained glass windows.
