NOTICE OF CONDEMNATION UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION ORDER TO VACATE

RE:

931 MARION ST

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on October 6, 2011.

The building was found to be unsafe, unfit for human habitation, a public nuisance, a hazard to the public welfare or otherwise dangerous to human life. A Condemnation Placard has been posted on the building.

The following deficiency list must be completed or the building vacated by the re-inspection date.

A re-inspection will be made on October 10, 2011 at 9:30 am.

CONDEMNATION OF THE BUILDING REVOKES THE CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

Failure to complete the corrections may result in a criminal citation. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. Exterior SPLC 34.08 (3) Provide and maintain suitable ground cover on all exterior areas to control erosion.
- 2. Exterior- Throughout SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the doors in good condition.

- 3. Exterior- Throughout SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window glass.
 - 4. Exterior- Throughout SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window frames.
 - 5. Exterior- Throughout SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Provide or repair and maintain the window screens.
 - 6. Exterior- Throughout SPLC 34.08 (5), 34.31 (3) Repair, replace and maintain all exterior surfaces on fences, sheds, garages and other accessory structures free from holes and deterioration. Provide and maintain exterior unprotected surfaces painted or protected from the elements.-Remove or repair the rear garage/shed to meet code. Permit may be required.
 - 7. Exterior/Interior SPLC 34.08 (1), 34.31 (1) All exterior property areas shall be maintained free from any accumulation of refuse, garbage or feces.-Remove all garbage and debris from the property including the garage/shed.
 - 8. Interior SPLC 34.19 Provide access to the inspector to all areas of the building.
 - 9. Interior SPLC 34.10 (5), 34.33 (4), 34.16 Provide and maintain interior in a clean and sanitary condition.-This building is a gross unsanitary home. There is rotting food, diapers, garbage and urine throughout.
 - 10. Interior SPLC 34.10 (6), 34.33 (5) Exterminate and control insects, rodents or other pests. Provide documentation of extermination.
 - 11. Interior SPLC 34.23, MSFC 110.1 This occupancy is condemned as unfit for human habitation. This occupancy must not be used until re-inspected and approved by this office.-This building was condemned for gross unsanitary conditions throughout. Clean and sanitize the entire unit.
 - 12. Interior- Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the walls in an approved manner.-Patch and paint the holes and/or cracks in the walls.
 - 13. Interior- Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the floors in an approved manner.
 - 14. Interior- Throughout MSFC 1011.2 Remove the materials that cause an exit obstruction. Maintain a clear and unobstructed exitway.-Remove all dirty laundry and rotting food from all exit areas.
 - 15. Interior- Throughout SPLC 34.16 (2) Properly dispose all of your garbage in the owner-provided containers.
 - 16. Interior-Throughout MSFC 1003.3.1.8 Remove unapproved locks from the unit doors. The door must be openable from the inside without the use of keys or special knowledge or effort.

- 17. Interior-Throughout MN Stat. 299F.362 Immediately provide and maintain a smoke detector located outside each sleeping area.
- 18. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 19. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the provided smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.

You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer. VACANT BUILDING REGISTRATION NOTICE

The premises at 931 MARION ST

has been inspected and found to meet the legal definition of a Vacant Building as described in Saint Paul Legislative Code, Chapter 43. You are required to register this building with the Department of Safety and Inspections, Vacant Buildings Division, by filling out and returning the registration form provided with this letter. You are also required to pay the annual Vacant Building Registration Fee of \$1,100.00 The fee is due upon receipt of this letter and must be paid no later than thirty (30) days from the date of this letter, as required in Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43. If this building is vacant due to a fire, complete the enclosed registration form and return it to this office within 30 days.

Please return the enclosed registration form along with your payment by November 14, 2011.

You may file an appeal to this fee or registration requirements by contacting the Office of the City Clerk at (651) 266-8688. Any appeal of this fee must be made within ten (10) days of the date of this notice.

If the registration fee is not received in this office within 45 days of the date of this letter the full amount owed will be assessed to, and collected with, the taxes for this property as permitted by Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43.

The Code Enforcement Officer has notified the Building Inspection And Design Section that this property meets the legal definition of a registered vacant building and in accordance with Legislative Code Chapter 33, no permits (except demolition, wrecking and removal permits) will be issued until the requirements of all applicable ordinances are fulfilled.

All category 2 and category 3 vacant buildings must be winterized with gas and water services shut off or, alternately, an excess flow gas valve must be installed in the dwelling, within sixty (60) days of the date of this Notice.

WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL IS REQUIRED BEFORE A CATEGORY 2 OR CATEGORY 3 VACANT BUILDING CAN BE OCCUPIED OR SOLD.

- Category 2: Requirements include: 1. register/re-register the building, 2. pay outstanding fee(s), 3. obtain a code compliance report, 4. submit for approval a rehab cost estimate from a licensed contractor and a schedule for completion of all code compliance work, 5. submit proof of financial responsibility acceptable to the City, and 6. obtain Zoning approval of the proposed use.
- Category 3: All requirements listed for Category 2 vacant buildings, AND obtain a Certificate of Occupancy OR Certificate of Code Compliance prior to the sale of the building.

If the use of this building meets the definition of a nonconforming use by the Zoning Code then the use will lose its nonconforming status 365 days from the date the building was declared vacant.

You must contact the Enforcement officer, Matt Dornfeld, at 651-266-1902 to find out what must be done before this building can be legally reoccupied.

The Enforcement Officer may declare this building(s) to constitute a Nuisance Building subject to demolition and issue an Order to Abate under authority of Legislative Code Chapter 45. In the event this building is declared a Nuisance Building subject to demolition, the Enforcement Officer will notify all owners and interested parties of the Order to Abate, as provided in the Legislative Code Chapter 45.
