## NOTICE OF CONDEMNATION UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION ORDER TO VACATE

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on October 3, 2011. On K suggestion to be a produced as a second second

The building was found to be unsafe, unfit for human habitation, a public nuisance, a hazard to the public welfare or otherwise dangerous to human life. A Condemnation Placard has been posted on the building.

The following deficiency list must be completed or the building vacated by the re-inspection date.

A reinspection will be made on October 20, 2011 at 12NOON.

CONDEMNATION OF THE BUILDING REVOKES THE CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

Failure to complete the corrections may result in a criminal citation. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy.

## **DEFICIENCY LIST**

1. Attic - MSFC1026.1 - Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. The minimum size must be 5 square feet of glazed area with a minimum of 24 inches of openable height and 20 inches of openable width. With a finished sill height not more than 48 inches. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651)-266-9090. Refer to the Escape Windows for Residential Occupancies handout for more

- information.-Casement window is 17 inches openable width and 36 inches openable height. There is no sill. Glazed is 16 inches in width by 34 inches in height.
- 2. BATHROOM SPLC 34.10 (4), 34.33 (3) Provide a bathroom floor impervious to water. After securing toilet to floor caulk the base.
- 3. BATHROOM SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the ceiling in an approved manner.-Repair or replace the damaged or deteriorated ceiling. Paint the ceiling. Patch the holes and/or cracks in the ceiling.
- 4. BATHROOM SPLC 34.11, SBC 2902.1, SPLC 34.17, MPC 415.0220 Repair or replace and maintain the plumbing fixture to an operational condition.-Repair or replace and maintain an approved private toilet. SECURE TOILET TO FLOOR
- 5. Bedroom North Westside SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Replace the window sash cord.
- 6. FENCES SPLC 34.08 (5), 34.31 (3) Repair, replace and maintain all exterior surfaces on FENCES, sheds, garages and other accessory structures free from holes and deterioration. Provide and maintain exterior unprotected surfaces painted or protected from the elements.
- 7. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 8. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the provided smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
- 9. MSFC 605.4 Discontinue use of all multi-plug adapters.-Various locations
- 10. MSFC 605.5 Discontinue use of extension cords used in lieu of permanent wiring.-Various locations
- 11. NEC 440.13 For cord-connected equipment such as room air conditioners, household refrigerators and freezers, drinking water coolers, and beverage dispensers, a separable connector or an attachment plug and receptacle shall be permitted to serve as the disconnecting means. The appliance must plug directly into a permanent outlet.
- 12. NEC 110-26 Provide and maintain a minimum of 36 inches clearance in front of all electrical panels.
- 13. SPLC 34.09 (1) b,c, 34.32 (1) b,c Provide and maintain all exterior walls free from holes and deterioration. ALL WOOD exterior unprotected surfaces must be painted or protected from the elements and maintained in a professional manner free from chipped or peeling paint.
- 14. MSFC 3404.2.13.2.2 All above/underground tanks which have been out of service over 90 days shall be pumped free of product, and cap/plug all fill lines, gage openings, vapor

returns, and pump connections. Vent lines shall remain open. Or properly remove tanks. (Permits)

- 15. UMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter. This work will require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.
- 16. UMC 1346.703 Provide 30 inches clearance around all mechanical equipment.
- 17. MSFC1026.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. Remove dresser and or bed that prevent escape through escape window.
