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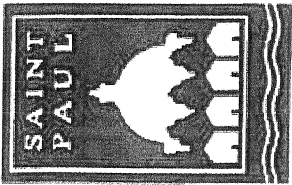

Fence heights allowed: Front Yard - 4 feet maximum, except for corner lots where an obscuring fence may only be 2 feet high at the corner of the intersection. Behind the front setback of the house and in the rear yard - 6 feet, 6 inches maximum. Call "GOPHER STATE ONE" @ 651-454-0002 to have utilities located before you dig.
