

FIRE INSPECTION CORRECTION NOTICE

RE: 1191 RICE ST

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on October 31, 2011 for the renewal of your Fire Certificate of Occupancy. Approval for occupancy will be granted upon compliance with the following deficiency list. The items on the list must be corrected prior to the re-inspection date.

A re-inspection will be made on December 13, 2011 at 12:00 (noon).

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or the revocation of the Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building shall be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional reinspection fees.

YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR NOTIFYING TENANTS IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING LIST OF DEFICIENCIES ARE THEIR RESPONSIBILITY.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. Exterior SPLC 34.08 (5), 34.31 (3) Repair, replace and maintain all exterior surfaces on fences, sheds, garages and other accessory structures free from holes and deterioration. Provide and maintain exterior unprotected surfaces painted or protected from the elements.-Repair or replace failed retaining wall.
- 2. Interior-Throughout MSFC1026.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. The minimum size must be 5 square feet of glazed area with a minimum of 24 inches of openable height and 20 inches of openable width. With a finished sill height not more than 48 inches. This work requires permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090. Refer to the Escape Windows for Residential Occupanices handout for more information.-The egress windows measured 15 H x 24 W (2) on the second floor bedrooms.

- 3. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.13 (3), SPLC 34.17 (2) Reduce and maintain the number of occupants in the sleeping rooms.
- 4. Interior-Throughout UMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter. This work requires a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.
- 5. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the cabinets in an approved manner.-Repair or replace the damaged or missing door in the kitchen.
- 6. Interior-Throughout MSFC 605.5.3 Immediately, discontinue use of frayed, deteriorated, damaged or spliced electrical cords.
- 7. Interior-Throughout MSFC 605.4 Discontinue use of all multi-plug adapters.-Remove the adapter from the freezer in the kitchen.
- 8. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office. Saint Paul Legislative Code authorizes this inspection and collection of inspection fees. You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer. Applications for appeals may be obtained at the Office of the City Clerk, 310 City Hall, City/County Courthouse, 15 W Kellogg Blvd, Saint Paul MN 55102 Phone: (651-266-8688) and must be filed within 10 days of the date of this order.
