NOTICE OF CONDEMNATION UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION ORDER TO VACATE

RE: 569 LAFOND AVE

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on October 20, 2011.

The building was found to be unsafe, unfit for human habitation, a public nuisance, a hazard to the public welfare or otherwise dangerous to human life. A Condemnation Placard has been posted on the building.

The following deficiency list must be completed or the building vacated by the re-inspection date.

A re-inspection will be made on January 18, 2012 at 9 am.

CONDEMNATION OF THE BUILDING REVOKES THE CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

Failure to complete the corrections may result in a criminal citation. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy.

DEFICIENCY LIST

1. Interior-Throughout - SPLC 34.10 (6), 34.33 (5) - Exterminate and control insects, rodents or other pests. Provide documentation of extermination.-Hire a licensed exterminator to eliminate mice, roaches, and other pests. Fax written verification.

- 2. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.23, MSFC 110.1 This occupancy is condemned as unfit for human habitation. This occupancy must not be used until re-inspected and approved by this office.-This building is condemned based on roach infestation. Live, huge roaches and babies crawling all over the building. Owner was notified to hire a licensed exterminator, but failed to do so. No documentation submitted.
- 3. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (5), 34.33 (4), 34.16 Provide and maintain interior in a clean and sanitary condition.-Remove all furniture, bedding, and debris from the building and have the entire home treated by a licensed exterminator.
- 4. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (4), 34.33 (3) Provide a bathroom floor impervious to water.
- 5. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the cabinets in an approved manner.
- 6. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the ceiling in an approved manner.-The plaster has been removed from walls. Pull permits to make repairs. **Permit approved.**
- 7. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the floor in an approved manner.
- 8. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair and maintain the walls in an approved manner.-Plaster walls have been removed. Pull permits to repair or replace the walls. **Permit approved.**
- 9. Interior-Throughout SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.33 (6) Repair or replace and maintain the woodwork in an approved manner.
- 10. Interior-Throughout UMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter. This work requires a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.-Hire a licensed contractor to install the dryer vents to meet code. Permit required.
- 11. Interior-Throughout MSFC1026.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. The minimum size must be 5 square feet of glazed area with a minimum of 24 inches of openable height and 20 inches of openable width. With a finished sill height not more than 48 inches. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090. Refer to the Escape Windows for Residential Occupanices handout for more information.-The windows on the second floor measure 19H x 26W in the side bedroom, and 20H x 26W in the front bedroom. Unable to measure the first floor unit due to debris and roaches. **Permit approved.**
- 12. Interior-Throughout MN Stat. 299F.362 Immediately provide and maintain a smoke detector located outside each sleeping area.

- 13. Interior-Throughout MN State Statute 299F.50 Immediately provide and maintain an approved Carbon Monoxide Alarm in a location within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Installation shall be in accordance with manufacturers instructions.
- 14. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 15. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the provided smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
