BOX#1:

The Saint Paul Police Department has a newly formed "Elder Abuse" Unit which is a sub-set of the Family & Sexual Violence Unit (FSVU) of the Major Crimes Division. This unit specializes on investigating cases involving elderly and/or vulnerable members of the community whose situations require special attention due to their circumstances. The department recognizes that members of these groups are 'at risk" for certain types of crime(s) that can best be addresses or prevented by having specially trained people investigate those crimes and by training our officers to recognize these risk factors in advance.

We are seeking support to help equip and educate ourselves and the community members we serve to capitalize on what we have identified as needs and opportunities after the first complete year of this newly formed specialty unit.

BOX#2:

The Elder Abuse Investigator has identified a significant amount of 'grassroots' support for this mission and we are seeking to create new partnerships with advocacy groups and community members to better reach this community. We are also looking to expand and improve existing partnerships with our established counterparts (i.e. Ramsey County Attorney's Office, Adult Protection, St. Paul Intervention Project, etc.) to identify ways to enhance prevention and support more complete investigations where needed.

The program will be advanced by building on existing methods that have proved successful in the areas of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assaults and Adult/Child Protection. It will seek to enhance/increase reporting through outreach, education and continued support and education.

BOX#3:

The St. Paul Police Department would like to be considered for annual support but this funding request would allow us, even on a one time basis, to provide needed equipment, educational materials and outreach opportunities that can often be stalled without initial 'start up" funds not otherwise available. The St. Paul Police Department also recognizes the opportunities as an individual agency and in cooperation with our existing partner groups to apply for future grant opportunities in this area on both the state and federal level(s).

BOX#4:

This project will have benefits in multiple areas. First, through better education of both community members, our own law enforcement officers and respective partner groups. These educational efforts will help teach the community how to best prevent and/or respond to situations involving elder abuse. It will help our officers to better understand and identify situations where community members are 'at risk" and how police action can contribute to a positive resolution or prevention in those areas. It will also expand the

systems understand of the special needs, risks and opportunities these cases present and how the groups can all work together to meet those needs.

Through these efforts we hope to prevent many crimes through avoidance and early detection (*reduce crime*), increase community awareness and confidence with better understanding (*community/public benefit*), and increase the effectiveness of our investigative and patrol efforts which allows for increased effectiveness through a more proficient application of resources (*officer safety/effectiveness*).

Regardless of how well written a police report is, the fact remains that video and still photo evidence will help overcome the commonly held bias that and adult should always be able to protect themselves. The video and still photo evidence generated by this equipment will underscore the critical threshold questions and criminal elements which establish probable cause to believe an adult is indeed vulnerable to physical, emotional or financial harm

Printing and paper materials: \$1,625.97

Purpose: There is a significant grassroots support for the mission of this unit. retired persons have many advocates in the form of both younger and older stakeholders. These funds will be used to get the word out to potential victims and their loved ones that resources do exist, persons are willing to help, and there is a powerful mechanism in place that can stand up for the rights and protections of the elder when they cannot do so for themselves.

Overtime: \$1,000.00

Purpose: This funding source will allow for the coordination and participation of police officers in after hours events. As noted in the section above, there is a significant grassroots group of volunteers waiting to be tapped as a resource on behalf of the elders in our community. However, many of these persons are also gainfully employed and only

have flexible schedules in the evening hours. This overtime allotment will afford police officers and investigators to spend time after or before their regular scheduled shift to assist in outreach activities, when necessary, and when changes in police employee hours are not reasonable or appropriate.

Training: \$1,200.00

Purpose: This funding source will allow for police investigators to attend specialized training events throughout the year related to the narrow requirements involved in some elder abuse investigations. Elder abuse often involves financial crimes as well as neglect or assault. There are many courses available through social service agencies or medical facilities that provide training in the detection and investigation of the latter, however, some of the more advanced training related to fraud and forgery investigations is offered for a fee.

ATTACHMENT - A

The St. Paul Police SWAT team consists of eight officers. These eight officers train every month and qualify with their specialized sniper rifles. It is paramount that these highly trained individual's sight in these rifles on a regular basis and hone their shooting skills. Under high levels of stress these officers must be able to make highly accurate shots in numerous different tactical scenarios. Although basic targets for zeroing rifles are currently provided to SPPD SWAT officers, other targets depicting situational based scenarios are not available. These specialized targets are available for purchase. These targets depict real life situations ranging from hostage situations to suspects carrying explosive devices. These targets offer an important training tool to help prepare the officer for real life scenarios that they otherwise would have a difficult time reproducing in a training setting.

Data books are also an important part of honing the officers shot placement. Using a data book to call and plot each shot of the officers shooting session allows the shooter to slow down the rate of fire, letting the officer build accuracy thru the firing progression of each and every shot. This allows the officer to make more effective hits while allowing the officer to go back and look at his/her hits and see where they may need to adjust their rifles in order to hit the center of their target(s). These books have a limited number of pages and are not transferable from sniper to sniper as each sniper shoots slightly different, and keeps track of his/her data unique to themselves and their rifle.

Data books and sniper targets are two items that are unpredictable in their rate of use. This makes it difficult for an agency to budget for these items. These items expire at unknown times depending on the amount of training required for new snipers and specialized training for special assignments and tactical situations. For this reason SWAT budgets don't always account for these specialized items. SPPD SWAT officers are currently in need of both sniper targets and sniper data books with no specific monies set aside to provide them at this time.

\$350.00 would help provide the SPPD Sniper team with the aforesaid specialized targets and new data books. Specialized paper targets would help to improve the team's current level of training while the data books are a necessary staple of the professional sniper. This money, if provided would aid in the continuing development and maintenance of the SPPD Snipers.

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
