WHEREAS, the St. Paul Comprehensive Land Use Plan calls for sustaining the character of Saint Paul's existing single-family neighborhoods like those covered in the proposed Student Housing Neighborhood Impact Overlay District ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Macalester-Groveland Community Plan likewise calls for maintaining the single-family character of the District:

WHEREAS, the Merriam Park Community Plan (incorporated now into Union Park) also calls for maintaining the area as one of predominantly owner-occupied single-family homes, while supporting opportunities for new rentals;

WHEREAS, the proposed ordinance would be conducive to creating and maintaining a livable neighborhood for all – students, homeowners, and college/university personnel;

WHEREAS, the West Summit Neighborhood Advisory Committee (WSNAC) has adopted the Louis Smith Report and its Findings and Conclusions with respect to tipping points and neighborhood sustainability;

WHEREAS, the Louis Smith tipping point finding reflects and supports resident comments over the years;
