Your building was re-inspected for the Fire Certificate of Occupancy on June 1, 2011. Approval for occupancy will be granted upon compliance with the following deficiency list. The items on the list must be corrected immediately. A reinspection will be made on or after July 1, 2011. COMPLIANCE MUST BE MET BY THIS DATE.

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or the revocation of the Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional reinspection fees.

I am writing to request to opportunity to possibly appeal a fire code deficiency list that was originally cited on June 1, 2011 at the Church of Saint Agnes in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Last year, we met with Jim Perucca from the Department of Safety and Inspections regarding the necessity of having approved panic release hardware on all exit doors. We were extremely grateful for his willingness to 'work with us' timing-wise, as we rolled this significant project into a broader Centennial Capital Campaign which became public just in June of 2012.

As we prepared to have the initial Church doors removed last month to not only have panic hardware installed, but to refurbish them as they were original to the 100 year old building, we invited Mr. Perucca out to meet with the company doing the work. As we were finalizing the plan for the larger main doors and their particular complexities, it was at this time that Mr. Perucca made us aware of the fact that the Cathedral of St. Paul had successfully appealed the requirement to have panic hardware due to the historic nature of the building.

Even though significant time has already passed, Mr. Perucca thought it might be worthwhile reaching out to the City and seeing if you would still consider an appeal under the circumstances.

We are prepared to move ahead with installing on all the public exits of the Church building facing east and west – as discussed with Mr. Perucca - but we would like to appeal the need for such hardware on the two north facing exits adjacent to the main exit facing Lafond Avenue (which is already exempt from the requirement). By attaining this variance, we will be able to best preserve the historic integrity of this 100 year old Frogtown landmark.

I am grateful for your consideration with our request.
