## 2012 Revised Planning Schedule

#### Items from Prior Schedule Finished

- 50% reduction in total storage completed by Feb 12 hrs
- Woodchip pile under tarp moved, tarp gone by April 8 hrs
- Woodchip paths half way around four raised beds 8 hrs
- Metal shelving with clay pots removed May 8 hrs
- Recycling combined and dispersed May 4 hrs
- Misc. trellising, pots, planting equipment stored elsewhere May 2 hrs
- Black soil mound on boulevard dispersed May 8 hrs

#### Other Urban Farming Seasonal Tasks Completed

- County site composted soil picked up/distributed to various beds 2 hrs
- Manure/sand picked up/stored in trailer, being distributed \* 2 hrs
- Weeds and debris picked from four raised beds 8 hrs
- Double digging and soil amendments added to raised beds 8 hrs
- Weekly mowing remaining lawn and 125' of boulevard 2 hrs wk
- Hardened off transplants watered and maintained waiting to be planted in amended raised beds - 2 hrs wk
- Transplant 60 tomato seedlings for resale 4 hrs
- Ongoing weeding of established beds 2 hrs wk
- New planting of perennial guilds 4 hrs
- Water all 150 perennial year old plantings 2 hrs wk depending upon weather

#### Items in Question:

Buckets for water and soil hauling

Pots of plants for planting, transplanting

\*Woodchip container and small pile to be converted into walls

\*Trailer w/ various plastic pots and mushroom cages covered with plastic tarp

\*Trailer w/ Manure and Sand – to be deposited in various beds as time permits or on specific holding site on property, (then becomes unsterile and full of weed seeds)

\*Beehive Boxes under tarp – used for beehives off site when honey season begins in July Bags of sand and gravel – used for pot drainage

\*Row square cement pavers

Wooden Crate holding "Browns"

Compost Bin holding "Greens" weed and grasses

Compost Bin for household waste

Original row of square cement pavers along back corner from being uplifted from failing patio design - (Could combine all pavers together until back patio construction)

Black Pots filled with amended soil for "Container Gardening" along back west wall (Could be placed along edge of Raised Garden Beds)

Bags of Sawdust under Tarp held down w flagstone, needed for obliterating compost and chicken smells – (took long time to find clean sawdust)

\*Two patches of Tall Grasses - Green Manures used in soil/compost building

- One under chicken coop run
- Other on Strawberry hill

\*\*Potting table w/ empty buckets for soil and water hauling

- In use for transplanting seedlings

Black soil pile on boulevard - Eliminated

- Used up now, made into garden bed
- Have established other area to receive incoming soil

Boulevard planter

-Too heavy to move without destroying-(used for vegetable growing)

\*Cardboard pile-(used in breaking sod under woodchip paths)

\*Woodchip paths around Raised beds

- Keeps moisture and temperature levels in raised beds constant

\*\*Trellis frames for vining crops, waiting to be installed when needed in late June.
Stacked rain barrels to be raised, connected and placed for increased water catchment

- \* Items addressed on Thurs 5/24 by YMCA youth leaders
- \*\* Needed during (3) successive transplant planting times
