And attempt was made to re-inspected your building for the Fire Certificate of Occupancy on May 13, 2013. Approval for occupancy will be granted upon compliance with the following deficiency list. The items on the list must be corrected immediately. A reinspection will be made on June 6, 2013 at 1:00P.M..

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or the revocation of the Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional reinspection fees.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. Basement work room MN Stat 299F.18 Immediately remove and discontinue excessive accumulation of combustible materials.-Removed all cans marked extremely flammable
- 2. Various locations MSFC 605.4 Discontinue use of all multi-plug adapters.-Stop using multiplug adapters.
- 3. Various locations MSFC 605.5 Discontinue use of extension cords used in lieu of permanent wiring.-Stop using extension cords. Usage exceeds amperage.
- 4. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 5. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.

- SPLC SEC 34/15 Flammable Liquids Storage. No residental structure or rooming unit shall be located within a building containing any establishment handling dispensing or storing flammable liquids with a flashpoint of less than one hundred ten 110 degrees Fahrenheit as defined by the National Board of Fire Underwriters .-Remove all propane from house. Removed at time of inspection
 - 7. MN Rules 1300.0180 Immediately discontinue use of unsafe heating appliance until repaired or replaced by a licensed contractor. This work WILL require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090.-Per owner furnace has to be replaced.
- 8. UMC 504.6 Provide, repair or replace the dryer exhaust duct. Exhaust ducts for domestic clothes dryers shall be constructed of metal and shall have a smooth interior finish. The exhaust duct shall be a minimum nominal size of four inches (102 mm) in diameter. This work will require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.
- 9. MN State Statute 299F.50 Immediately provide and maintain an approved Carbon Monoxide Alarm in a location within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Installation shall be in accordance with manufacturers instructions.
