1 An ordinance revising Legislative Code Chapter 90 pertaining to deposits and charges for 2 hydrant use permits. 3 4 THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL DOES ORDAIN: 5 6 Section 1. 7 8 That chapter 90 of Saint Paul Legislative Code is hereby amended as follows: 9 10 Chapter 90. - Water Code - Fire Hydrants 11 12 Sec. 90.03. Cash deposit required. 13 14 Applicants to whom permits are granted shall be required to make a cash deposit 15 of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$500.001,000.00) in advance. The deposit is for the 16 purpose of guaranteeing payment for water used, charges accrued and to cover any 17 breakage or damage to the fire hydrant or meter. Upon return of the equipment issued to 18 the permittee by the utility, said deposit, less charges against the permittee's account, will 19 be returned to the permittee. 20 21 Sec. 90.04. – Charges for hydrant use permitsrental. 22 23 (a) A charge of forty dollars (\$40.00) plus all applicable sales taxes shall be applied 24 will be made for each permit for each thirty-day period or fraction thereof. Such 25 charge is to cover the cost of permit administration. 26 (b) A charge of ten dollars (\$10.00) plus all applicable sales taxes for each thirty-day 27 period or fraction thereof shall be applied will be made for each hydrant used by 28 the permittee. Such charge is to cover the cost of inspection and ordinary wear 29 and tear on the hydrant. 30 (c) In addition to the rental charge and any charge for breakage, aA charge for the 31 volume of water plus all applicable sales taxescharge will also shall be applied made for all water used according to the highest waterregular consumption rate. 32 33 Measurement of water volumeused shall be by use of the hydrant meter issued to 34 each permittee or by estimate if meter reading is unavailable or deemed inaccurate 35 by the water utility. 36 (d) Charges for the water service base fee and right-of-way recovery fees, and other 37 charges as may be established by city council plus all applicable sales taxes shall 38 be applied and shall not be less than those applied to any retail water account. 39 (e) If the water utility approves issuance of a hydrant permit during the period from 40 December 1 to April 1, an additional charge of thirty dollars (\$30.00) plus all 41 applicable sales taxes shall be applied will be made for each thirty-day period or 42 fraction thereof. Such additional charge is to compensate for the cost of 43 extraordinary inspection required when a hydrant is operated during winter 44 months. 45 46 Section 2.

All other sections of Chapter 90 shall remain unchanged.
