### **CORRECTION NOTICE - COMPLAINT INSPECTION**

RE: 915 HAWTHORNE AVE E

Dear Property Representative:

An inspection was made of your building on June 25, 2012 in response to a referral. You are hereby notified that the following deficiency list must be corrected immediately. A re-inspection will be made on August 1, 2012 at 10:00AM.

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or revocation of the Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional re-inspection fees.

#### **DEFICIENCY LIST**

- 1. BASEMENT APPLIANCES - RE-ARRANGE POWER SOURCE - NEC 440.13 - For cord-connected equipment such as room air conditioners, household refrigerators and freezers, drinking water coolers, and beverage dispensers, a separable connector or an attachment plug and receptacle shall be permitted to serve as the disconnecting means. The appliance must plug directly into a permanent outlet.-Rearrange the basement refrigerator and dehumidifier so they plug directly into a wall outlet without the aide of an extension cord or power strip. May need additional outlets for these appliances.
- 2. BASEMENT STAIRS - STORAGE - MSFC 104.9, 1005.3.2.2 - Remove the storage under the stairs or provide and maintain 1 hour fire resistive construction on the storage side of the stairs.
- DISCONTINUE EXTENSION CORD USE TO MICROWAVE OVEN MSFC 605.5 Discontinue 3. use of extension cords used in lieu of permanent wiring. Rearrange appliances so they plug directly into a wall outlet or UL listed power strip with an internal circuit breaker.-Rearrange the microwave oven in the kitchen.
- HEATING EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION SPLC 34.11 (6), 4. 34.34 (3) - Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.

- 5. KITCHEN PROVIDE FIRE EXTINGUISHER MSFC 906.1, MN Stat. 299F.361 Provide approved fire extinguishers in accordance with the following types, sizes and locations.-Provide minimum 2A10BC fire extinguishers in the kitchen. It must be permanently mounted between 3 and 5 feet high in readily visible and easily accessible location.
- 6. KITCHEN STOVE PROVIDE GAS SHUT OFF VALVE MFGC 409.5 Provide an approved gas shut off valve within 6 feet of the appliance in accordance with the mechanical code. This work may require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.-Provide a gas shut off valve to the kitchen stove.
- 7. SECOND STORY BEDROOM WINDOWS UNAPPROVED EGRESS WINDOW SIZE MSFC1026.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room. The minimum size must be 5 square feet of glazed area with a minimum of 24 inches of openable height and 20 inches of openable width. With a finished sill height not more than 48 inches. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090. Refer to the Escape Windows for Residential Occupancies handout for more information.-Two second story bedrooms both have egress windows with openable height of 19 inches, and openable width of 25 inches. \*You may appeal this order to the Legislative Hearing Officer.
  - 8. SECOND STORY BEDROOMS PROVIDE CO2 ALARM MN State Statute 299F.50 Immediately provide and maintain an approved Carbon Monoxide Alarm in a location within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Installation shall be in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.-Provide a Carbon Monoxide Alarm for the second story bedrooms.
  - 9. Remove and replace the two back doors double cylinder locks with interior thumb turn locks.
