**BUDGET OF THE HRA DISPOSITION WORK PLAN.** 

#### **Requested Board Action**

The specific actions being requested of the HRA Board are as follows:

- 1) Authorization to accept \$840,000 from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Impact Fund and \$200,000 from the Metropolitan Council Local Housing Incentives Account program.
- 2) Amendment to increase the HRA Disposition Work Plan and Budget by \$1,040,000.

## Background

In the spring of 2013, Planning and Economic Development (PED) staff analyzed all property in the HRA inventory in an effort to make informed recommendations regarding the retention and disposition of properties, and create a disposition strategy and budget to advance redevelopment plans for the sites analyzed. The resulting strategy was designed to address 240 of the 535 parcels in the HRA inventory by grouping them into four different categories: Parcels with Obligations, Cluster Area Parcels, Splinter Parcels, and Buildable Lots for Sale. The Disposition Work Plan and Budget (DWPB) was presented to, and approved by, the HRA Board of Commissioners on July 24, 2013 by Resolution 13-1097. As a component of the Resolution, the Neighborhood Stabilization Program and Invest Saint Paul were rebranded as the Inspiring Communities program, which prioritizes subsidy to address two categories of the DWPB: Cluster Area Parcels and Parcels with Obligations.

To fully implement the DWPB, it was projected that \$12 million would need to be identified from various internal and external sources. To date, staff has identified, and the HRA Board has approved, \$5,060,000. Staff has secured, and is seeking HRA Board approval to accept, an \$840,000 grant award from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency and \$200,000 from the Metropolitan Council, for a net increase of \$1,040,000 in the DWPB.

## **Budget Action**

The current board action is to accept a grant award of \$840,000 from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency and \$200,000 from the Metropolitan Council, and approve a budget amendment to increase the DWPB by \$1,040,000. (See **Attachment A.**)

### **Future Action**

Consistent with Resolution 13-1097, all expenditures of the DWPB will be specifically authorized through future HRA Board Action.
