NOTICE OF INTENT TO REVOKE LICENSES

Dear Mr. McKusick:

The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) has recommended revocation of the Taxicab Vehicle licenses for Cab #2540 and Cab #2544 held by Cabs R Us, LLC d/b/a Town Taxi & Transportation for the City of Saint Paul. The basis for the recommendation is as follows:

**On February 10, 2014, the Department of Safety and Inspection (DSI) received notices from the Minnesota Department of Revenue stating that you had an overdue tax liability for Cab #2540 and Cab #2544. According to Minn. Stat. § 270C.72, Subd. 1, your licenses must be revoked until your tax delinquency is resolved and DSI receives a Clearance Certificate from the Department of Revenue.**

At this time, you have three (3) options how to proceed:

1. You can submit payment of the overdue tax liability for Cab #2540 and Cab #2544. If this is your choice you should send the payment directly to the Minnesota Department of Revenue no later than **Monday, March 10, 2014**. Payment of the overdue tax liability will be considered to be a waiver of the hearing to which you are entitled.
2. If you wish to admit the facts but contest the penalty, you may have a public hearing before the Saint Paul City Council, you will need to send me a letter with a statement admitting the facts and requesting a public hearing. We will need to receive your letter by **Monday, March 10, 2014**. The matter will then be scheduled before the City Council for a public hearing to determine whether to revoke your licenses. You will have an opportunity to appear before the Council and make a statement on your own behalf.


3. If you dispute the facts outlined above, you may request a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). I will need to receive your letter no later than **Monday, March 10, 2014**. At that hearing both you and the City will appear and present witnesses, evidence and cross-examine each other's witnesses. After receipt of the ALJ's report (usually within 30 days), a public hearing will need to be scheduled. At that time, the City Council will decide whether to adopt, modify or reject the ALJ's report and recommendation.

Please note: If you choose an administrative hearing, the Department of Safety and Inspections reserves the right to request that City Council impose the costs of the administrative hearing per Saint Paul Legislative Code § 310.05 (k).

**If you have not contacted me or DSI by Monday, March 10, 2014, I will assume that you do not contest the revocation of your licenses. In that case, the matter will be placed on the City Council Consent Agenda for approval of the recommended penalty.**
