NEBA is greatly aware that signage is extremely effective advertizing for most every store front business. Dynamic display signage is relatively new and apparently the future for the signage medium. The comparative advantage may be relative to both the particular business and application.

Both the residential and commercial stock in the North End are aging and in need of many changes to both practices and infrastructure going forward. The North End and all traffic crossing the Rice Maryland intersection will enjoy greater safety due to the recent turn lane addition and enhancements. This was a major project. As a community, we will persevere.

NEBA is on record maintaining the belief and operational understanding that good commercial centers cannot exist without good surrounding residential communities. We are committed to making the North End both a good place to live and shop. Having said this, and understanding that the size and set back requirements are satisfied, NEBA is inclined to support the variance requesting multi color dynamic display. The world is in color.
