
votive candles, floral centerpieces, all meant to accompany the lasagna, pasta and other treats catered from Cosetta's Eatery and Pizzaria.

His occupation in security puts him in communication with the police department on a continual basis as they work together to prevent theft and promote safety within the Target store. By building these relationships Safecity hopes to find proactive ways to identify and confront chronic life controlling issues in families and individuals that results in habitual criminal activity.
