Board approves 10-year capital investment plan

The Board of Water Commissioners passed a resolution at the March 10 meeting directing staff to include the SPRWS 10-year capital investment plan in the 2016 - 2019 strategic plan. It will be developed later this year and will be formally approved by the board this fall.

This means that we will be including the projects and programs outlined in the strategic plan in our budget proposals for the coming years. Each year's specific budget needs to be approved by the board and city council, but having the board pass this resolution provides us with broad background support for the investments. This support will be critical in getting the annual budgets (that include the projects) approved.

"I want to thank each and every one of you for your

part in bringing this effort, that began nearly two years ago, to this successful conclusion," said Steve Schneider, general manager. "All of the time and energy in the asset assessments, the other consultant studies, the financial analysis, and the many meetings and discussions were absolutely critical to our success.

Free tax help is available
