## NOTICE OF INTENT TO DENY LICENSE

Guadie Damte Jemberu 1318 Maynard Drive West, Apt. 466 St. Paul, MN 55116

RE: Taxicab Driver (Provisional) license application submitted by Guadie Damte Jemberu for the City of Saint Paul

Dear Mr. Jemberu:

The Department of Safety and Inspections will recommend denial of the Taxicab Driver (Provisional) license application submitted by Guadie Damte Jemberu for the City of Saint Paul. The recommendation is based on the following information:

On May 21, 2015, you submitted a Taxicab Driver (Provisional) license application to the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI). During a routine criminal history check as part of the application process, DSI discovered that you had been convicted on February 27, 2015 of Gross Misdemeanor Prostitution-Patrons-Hires-Offers, Or Agrees to Hire To Engage In Prostitution In Public Place in Hennepin County District Court (Minn. Stat. § 609.324.2 (2). You were placed on two (2) years' probation which is due to expire on February 27, 2017.

Saint Paul Legislative Code 376.16 (e) (4) (a) states the basis for adverse action: ".... or under sentence or have been discharged from sentence for any non-traffic gross misdemeanor or non-traffic misdemeanor conviction within three (3) years immediately preceding application for a license." Based on this information, you would not be eligible to apply for a Taxicab Driver license until after February 27, 2020.

In addition, Saint Paul Legislative Code Section 310 provides that adverse action may be taken against your license application based on the following grounds:

Section 310.06 (b) (c): "the licensee or applicant (or any person whose conduct may by law be imputed to the licensee or applicant) has engaged in or permitted a pattern or practice of conduct of failure to comply with laws reasonably related to the licensed activity or from which an inference of lack of fitness or good character may be drawn."

At this time, you have four (4) options to proceed:

- 1. If you do not contest the imposition of the proposed adverse action, you may do nothing. If I have not heard from you by **Monday**, **June 22**, **2015**, I will presume that you have chosen not to contest the proposed adverse action, and the matter will be placed on the City Council agenda for approval of the proposed remedy.
- 2. If you wish to admit the facts but you contest the penalty, you may have a public hearing before the Saint Paul City Council. You will need to send me a letter with a statement admitting to the facts and requesting a public hearing. I will need to receive your letter no later than Monday, June 22, 2015. The matter will then be scheduled before the City Council for a public hearing to determine whether to deny your Taxicab Driver (Provisional) license. You will have an opportunity to appear before the Council and make a statement on your own behalf.
- 3. If you dispute the facts outlined above, or wish to present evidence that the conviction is not related to your license as a taxicab driver, or that you have been rehabilitated pursuant to Minn. Stat. §364.01 et seq, you may request a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). I will need to receive your letter no later than Monday, June 22, 2015. At that hearing both you and the City will appear and present witnesses, evidence and cross-examine each other's witnesses. After receipt of the ALJ's report (usually within 30 days), a public hearing will need to be scheduled. At that time, the City Council will decide whether to adopt, modify or reject the ALJ's report and recommendation.

Please note: If you choose an administrative hearing, the Department of Safety and Inspections reserves the right to request that City Council impose the costs of the administrative hearing per Saint Paul Legislative Code § 310.05 (k).

4. You may withdraw your license application. Send a written statement to that effect to the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI), 375 Jackson Street, Ste. 220, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101-1806 no later than Monday, June 22, 2015. Information should be directed to the attention of Dan Niziolek. Any request for a refund of the license application fee must also be made in writing to the Department of Safety and Inspections.

If you have not contacted me or DSI by Monday, June 22, 2015, I will assume that you do not contest the denial of your Taxicab Driver (Provisional) license. In that case, the matter will be placed on the City Council Consent Agenda for approval of the recommended penalty.
