The City of Saint Paul, Department of Safety and Inspections has inspected the above referenced property on **January 20, 2016** and has determined that the following deficiencies exist in violation of the Saint Paul Legislative Code¹ (see footnote 1, below).

1. RESIDENTIAL PARKING ON UNAPPROVED SURFACE: ALL RESIDENTIAL PARKING SPACES SHALL BE PAVED WITH ASPHALT, CONCRETE OR OTHER SUITABLE SURFACING AS DETERMINED BY ZONING ENFORCEMENT. CEASE PARKING ON UNAPPROVED SURFACES. FOR INFORMATION ON INSTALLATION OF AN APPROVED PARKING SURFACE CONTACT ZONING ENFORCEMENT AT 651.266-9008 REGARDING SUBMITTAL AND APPROVAL OF A SITE PLAN.

You are hereby notified to correct these deficiencies in accordance with the appropriate codes. The Enforcement Officer will reinspect these premises on or after January 25, 2016, by which date the violations noted must be corrected. Failure to correct these deficiencies may result in the issuance of criminal charges² and/or a civil lawsuit, and possible abatement/assessment by the City. All repairs and new installations must be made in accordance with the appropriate codes. Permits may be obtained by calling 651-266-8989.

You may file an appeal to this notice by contacting the City Clerk at 651-266-8585. Any appeal must be made in writing within 10 days of this notice. (You must submit a copy of this Notice when you appeal, and pay a filing fee.)
