Innovation Fund \$85,275

Quick History:

There was interest to create a fund for district councils to undertake initiatives that had a citywide impact and addressed citywide issues in a creative way. After applying the formula to the Community Engagement funds, there was some left over that was earmarked to be for the Innovation Fund.

A competitive process was developed for the Innovation Fund. An advisory committee reviews the application and recommends funding to the City Council and Mayor. The Innovation Fund has \$80,000 to \$100,000 to distribute each year. I manage the Innovation Fund contracts.
