Stat. \$340A.404, subd. 1(4), which requires that the organization shall have been in existence for at least three years, and liquor sales will be only to members and bona fide guests. Here is a draft ordinance for your review. It provides as follows (in summary description):

Section 1. It re-defines "club" to include the additional restrictions imposed by state law on the on-sale licensing of clubs to sell hard liquor. None of the conditions should be a problem for established clubs.

Section 2. The club fee is limited by state law, e.g., \$300 annual fee for a club with under 200 members; \$500 for a club of 201-500 members; and so on. Sec. 340A.408.

Section 3. Prohibits sales to nonmembers, as mandated by state law.

Section 4. Exemption from "anti-concentration" language, for grandfathering.

Section 5. A club switching from club to on-sale license is grand-fathered at its present location.

Section 6. No new private club licenses issued after January 1, 1990; no renewals of licenses terminating in 1990.

Section 7. Chapter 404 (private club licenses) is repealed January 1, 1991.

Section 8. Definition of club for 3.2 licenses.

Section 9. Grandfathering for 3.2 licenses replacing club licenses.

NOTE: A. In each case, the new on-sale licenses will be subject to all regulations, including gambling and chariable gambling, which apply to other licenseholders.

B. The 3.2 license does not restrict sales to members, because state law does not.
