Dear Councilmembers,

I'm writing to request your support for adding bike lanes on Upper Afton Rd. during the Ramsey County resurfacing project this year. Tomorrow's agenda looks full and I'm unable to attend in person so this email is my testimony.

I live on the corner of Upper Afton and E. Sandra Lee Dr. in Ward 7 and I now have two kids who will be growing up in this neighborhood. I support the addition of bike lanes because it will provide my family a safer route to access Battle Creek Regional Park, Battle Creek Rec Center and playground, and the businesses on Suburban Ave. These amenities are why we chose to live in this neighborhood!

I'm not a strong cyclist (understatement of the year), but I recently bought a used bike and a burley for my kids to ride in. Unfortunately, I do not feel safe riding on the street without some separation from traffic and this could make all the difference. Also, Upper Afton is currently too wide and cars drive too fast. We walk our dog along the road and it makes me nervous to have my 3 year old walk with me since cars are racing down the street and the sidewalk is pretty narrow. I hope the bike lanes will calm traffic and provide a buffer for the sidewalk as well.

Finally, I'd like to make a plug for improving the pedestrian crossings on this road. Most notably, the uncontrolled intersection where Battle Creek Regional Trail crosses Upper Afton. Currently, there are yellow ped signs and white stripes, but I would love to see a park-like treatment here that makes cars more aware and signals to passersby that they are driving through a park. Battle Creek makes my neighborhood really special and, if given the proper treatment, will continue to attract families who want to enjoy the convenience of city living in a more natural setting.

I'd like to thank Councilmember Prince and Stephanie for their work listening to neighborhood concerns and working through issues. I think the proposed striping treatment and resurfacing will make my neighborhood an even better place to live. Thank you for your consideration of this project. Can't wait to come back to work! (Well, in a few weeks, that is.)
