










Growth over time


Number of children reached in early childhood & elementary




Total reach in early childhood & elementary through 2014-15 school year




This school year: Moving toward saturation point




School-approach: Pieces falling into place








Up to 44 days of summer learning

50 families at Jackson, Maxfield, and Saint Paul City School secured housing through December 2015
















Impact of Family Wraparounds
