We work with many business and government agencies in the Twin Cities area. I know that I speak for most Small Businesses in this community when I say we have **grave concerns about this ordinance!** This ordinance would put many small businesses "out of business". The assumptions that are being made by the Council in regards to this ordinance and that the purpose is to "diminish public and private health-care costs" are simply not true and we see no data to support this assumption. We cannot afford this. Our margins are so low as it is and to have burden of costs would destroy many businesses. This ordinance is unreasonable.
