crews and restoration crews. It will also cover water quality. The tour will be held on Tuesday, September 13, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Brad Eilts will lead the tour.

The October tour covers our supply system, starting at the Mississippi River and the pumps at Fridley station. It will follow the water to Charley, Pleasant, Sucker, and Vadnais lakes. You will get to see ongoing zebra mussel maintenance and learn about man-made and natural treatment processes. You will also learn about our relationships with our watersheds.

This tour will be led by Jim Bode. It will run from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 4.

Both tours will meet in the cafeteria 10 minutes prior to start of the tour. You need to wear closed-toe shoes on the tour while any safety gear will be provided for you.

You will need to get permission from your supervisor before attending. The tours are limited to 10 employees who have more than one year of service at the utility.
