Recently the St. Paul Police Department has responded to numerous reports of groups of male and female juveniles and young adults robbing, assaulting, harassing, threatening and stealing from law-abiding citizens within the Snelling Corridor and Midway area. In addition, officers have responded to numerous criminal damage complaints, large groups gathering to fight, and other acts of intimidation within this area. These violent acts and offenses are occurring on the streets and parks, in and around area businesses, and on Metro Transit property. These acts have caused law-abiding citizens who reside in the area and/or frequent businesses in the area to feel unsafe. Often the victims of these acts are children and adults of a more vulnerable

psychological and/or physical nature. This would include people mentally handicapped, elderly, resigned to wheel chairs, intoxicated, and homeless.

Steps that have been taken to address these actions and offenses include reallocation of citywide police resources to include focused enforcement, bike and foot patrol, plain clothes and uniform presence, increased traffic enforcement, crime prevention techniques, partnering with Metropolitan Transit Police, Minnesota State Patrol and Ramsey County Probation, training residents and business owners, holding Safe Summer Night Picnics and Community Meetings, and utilizing the Department "Ambassador Program".

The Ambassador program consists of non-law enforcement personnel interacting with juveniles and young adults throughout the city. This interaction is an effort to educate the juveniles and young adults about conduct, personal safety, and remaining law abiding. In addition, the Ambassador program helps connect the juveniles and young adults with tutoring, social services, counseling, mentorship programs, and employment opportunities.

While the Department has taken numerous steps to reduce the amount of violent criminal behavior, not just within the Snelling Corridor Midway Area (SCMA) but citywide as well, the accompanying reports concern the
