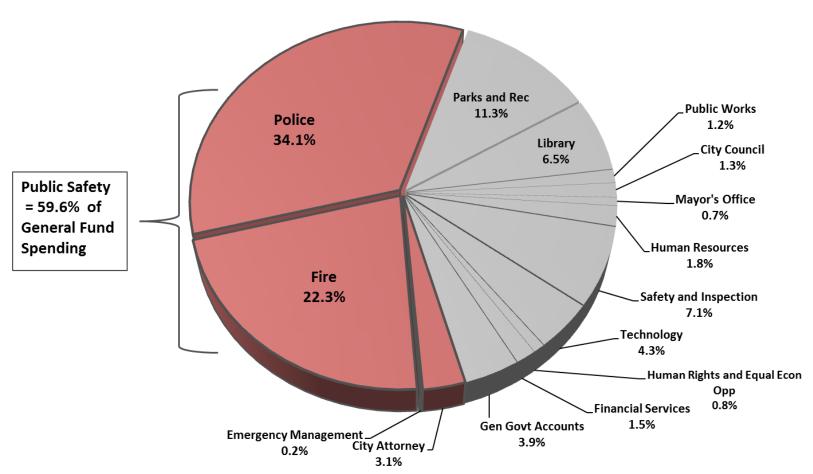

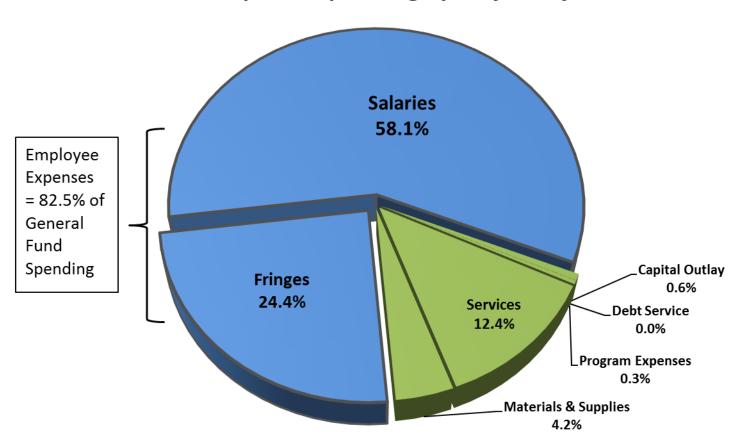

General Fund Budget 2017 Proposed Spending by Department

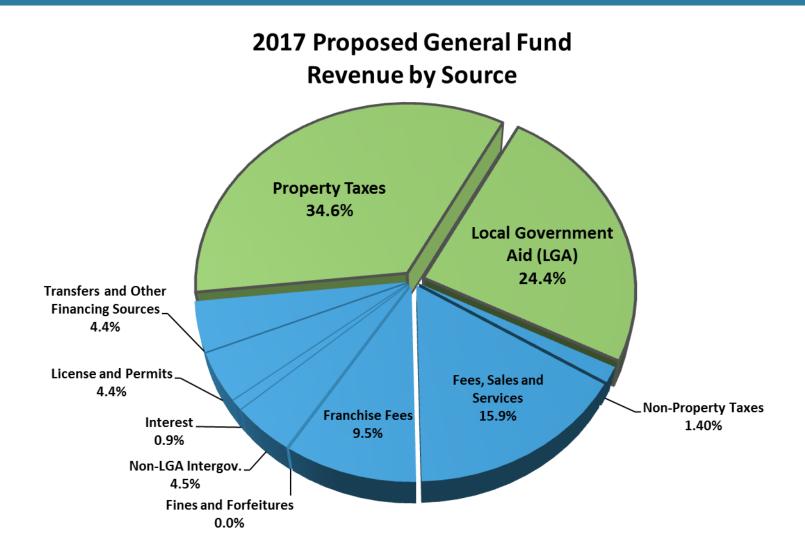


General Fund largely supports personnel expenses

Most General Fund revenue comes from state aids and property taxes

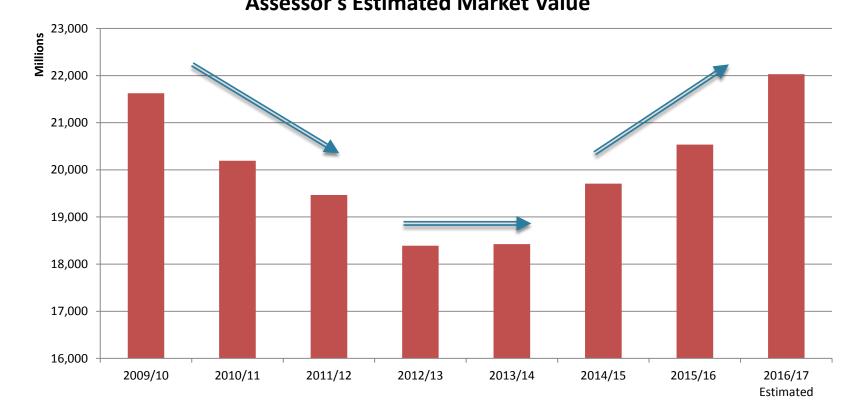


2017 Property Tax Environment

- Property value growth continues to be robust in Saint Paul.
- The City of Saint Paul levy is proposed to increase by 7.94%. Tax levies for all jurisdictions in Ramsey County are increasing by 4.3% in aggregate.
- Apartment property values are growing faster than residential and commercial properties.
- Significant property tax shifts continuing among residential properties across the city.

Assessor's Estimated Market Value



Ramsey County estimates a 7.3% increase in estimated market value for payable 2017 after strong growth in payable 2015 and 2016.
