Description of Variance:

Location: Wellesley Avenue from Davern Street to Wheeler Street

Noise Source: Insituform has applied for eight (8) sound level variances, at various locations, for operating general construction/demolition equipment and other repair and installation equipment for replacement, set up and installation of a cured in place sewer pipe. Rehabilitation of deteriorated and corroded damage to the sewer pipe is required. Work is to take place on Wellesley Avenue from Davern Street to Wheeler Street. The project proposes to allow elevated sound levels during one 24 hour per day period at each of the eight sewer pipe rehabilitation sites, between the dates of Monday, April 24, 2017 to Thursday, August 31, 2017 including the Wellesley Avenue from Davern Street to Wheeler Street site, with a sewer liner curing process requiring 24 hours of continuous work. Applicant indicates the site set up to occur from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., with use of equipment with back up alarms and hand held power tools. From 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. of the following day, the only equipment to be used will be critically silenced pumps and truck mounted boiler, not to exceed 70 decibels (dBA) at 50 feet. The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) is recommending that the occupants of property located within 400 feet of the work location be notified in writing by Insituform a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of the work. DSI also recommends that Insituform provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with the variance conditions. Contractors working on the project to use best practicable methods for controlling noise, such as, but not limited to noise blankets, shields or portable sound barriers. Construction activities should be scheduled to minimize noise as much as possible in the late night and early morning hours.
