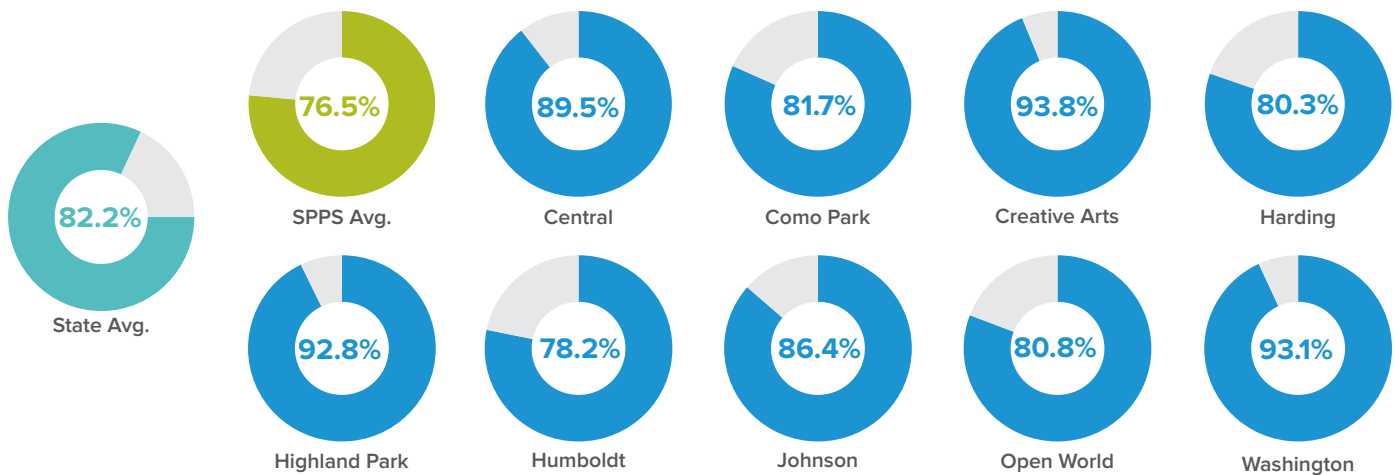


SPPS Four-Year Graduation Rate Hits All-Time High in 2016

The four-year student graduation rates for Saint Paul Public Schools (SPPS) was 1.5 percentage points higher than 2015 with admirable results across both traditional and non-traditional secondary schools.

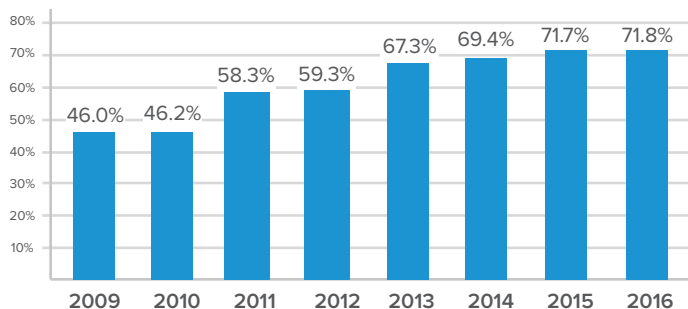
2016 SPPS Four-Year Graduation Rates*



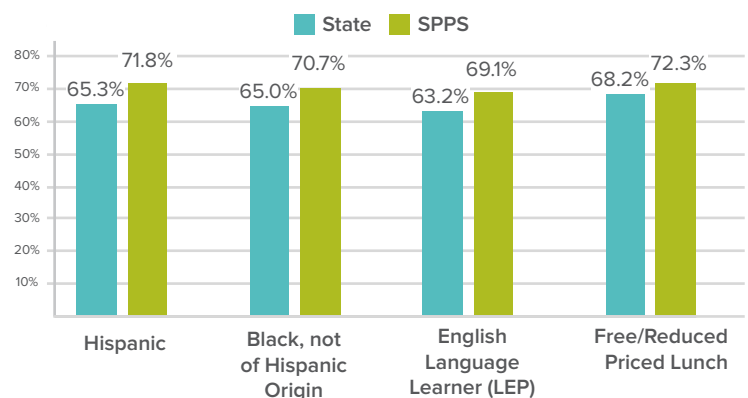
* AGAPE High School, Bridge View School, Focus Beyond, Gordon Parks High Schools, Journeys Secondary School and LEAP High School included in SPPS average

Other Graduation Data

Graduation rates for Hispanic students were higher for the seventh consecutive year



Hispanic, Black, English Language Learners, and students eligible for free/reduced lunch higher than the state



Highlights

- Creative Arts Secondary (a priority school), attained the highest four-year rate in SPPS: 93.8%, 17.6 pct. pts. higher than 2015 (76.2%).
- Highland Park Senior and Washington Technology Magnet had higher 2016 graduation rates for three consecutive years.
- Asian students at Highland Park Senior had a four-year graduation rate of 100%.
