Dear Saint Paul City Council Members,

Justice delayed is justice denied.

For decades, the tobacco industry has preyed on African Americans with menthol tobacco. Targeted advertisements, marketing and promotions blanket black neighborhoods. Rap artists and jazz musicians on the payroll of the makers of Newport and Kool make it seem like menthol tobacco is "our" tobacco. Their promotions have worked. Of African Americans who smoke, about 88 percent use menthol.

As Minnesota spoken word artist Joe Davis says, "Menthol helps the poison go down." It makes it easier to start and harder to quit. Menthol tobacco use contributes to health disparities, and Minnesota has among the most challenging health disparities in the nation despite our world-class health care system. It is clear action must be taken to remedy this problem.

In 2016, the Saint Paul City Council voted to only allow flavored tobacco to be sold from adult-only tobacco shops. The council left out the most dangerous flavor of all: menthol. When many of us testified before the council, we said menthol was the bigger problem, and we were coming back to you to fix it. Now, we ask for that fix. It is not justice that predatory marketing and promotion continues to hook young African Americans and condemn them to a lifetime of struggle with addiction. It is not justice that the only tobacco flavor the City of Saint Paul ignores is the flavor that is killing Black men and women. It is not justice that something could be done and has not.

We know a small number of businesses will lose profits when menthol regulations are implemented. But the choice is a simple one: the lives and futures of Black and poor youth or the profits of a few. We choose life. We urge you to do the same.
