Project/Program Title Capital City Bike Cops for Kids and Training

\* Project/Program Description Saint Paul Police Department (SPPD) requests funding for two project. Bike Cops for Kids, and to provide training resources for our three technicians preparing video evidence. A brief summary of each project follows:

https://www.regonline.com/builder/site/Default.aspx?EventID=1943045 1. SPPD is creating a video evidence team, which at full capacity will include five technicians. The unit will manage the filing of video footage through body wom carneras. They will also help prepare digital evidence acquired from outside sources for use in building cases and supporting investigations. Examples include retail, hotel, or gas station security camera footage reviewed for homicide, burglary, or other types of crimes. SPPD is seeking funding for training for the new hires for the unit. They will altend a digital evidence recovery training in 2018.

Capital City Bike Cops for Kids is expanding on a successful model program in Minneapolis. SPPD patrol officers will bike through neighborhood streets stopping young cyclist to provide helmets and safety gear. The aim is to make city streets safer for our youth - one connection at a time.

Traffic safety education will be used as an avenue to foster positive police interactions. Officers will stop youth to offer basic instruction on obeying the rules of the road, proper bike maintenance, and to suggest safe bike routes. The program will begin in the Western district, and expand to other neighborhoods with available resources.

Saint Paul police officers will be on the hunt to identify and recognize our safest cyclist. Youth proudly sporting SPPD badges, and demonstrating safe behavior, will be entered into a raffle to win a new bike. Through resources from the Target Corporation, up to 30 youth a year will receive the opportunity

Primary Project/Program Expenses \$1,000 for Supplies: giveaways for traffic stops with the SPPD emblems. Examples: stickers, bike locks, water bottles \$4,000 for Equipment: 28-32 child size bikes of varying sizes averaging \$125 each.

\$2,000 for training: SPPD will send three officers to digital evidence recovery training. The cost of the training is \$895, SPPD plans to send three staff for a total costs of \$2685, with the target grant covering \$2,000 and SPPD covering the balance.

\* Use of Target Grant The grant will provide supplies and equipment, matched through in-kind support.

Gillett Children's Specialty Health provided 1000 helmets to giveaway in low-income neighborhoods, increasing the safety of young cyclist. Officers will conduct 2,000 fun 'traffic stops' and safety lessons. Youth who engage receive a Bike Cops for Kids emblem, creating thousands of messengers for bike safety. Spontaneous bike rodeos will be hosted offering youth the opportunity to show off their bike safety skills
