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# **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

# Patrick McGovern's – St Patrick's Day 2018 Sound Level Variance

Dear St. Paul Property Owner:

This is to inform you of a request for a variance from the sound level limitations as indicated in the St. Paul Noise Ordinance (Chapter 293 of the St. Paul Legislative Code). Property owned by you and located near the noise source, may be affected by this variance request. <u>Rental property owners must provide a copy of this notice to all renters or post a copy in a common area of the building so it can be viewed by the occupants.</u>

#### **Description of Variance:**

## Locations: 225 7th Street West

**Noise Source:** Patrick McGovern's has requested a sound level variance, at requested sound level limit of 80-95 dBA at no specified distance, to present amplified music in an enclosed tent with use of a sound system for a St. Patrick's Day Event on Saturday, March 17, 2018 at 225 7<sup>th</sup> Street West. The variance is requested for the hours of 3:00 p.m.to midnight, with a pre-event sound check at 2:00 p.m. The Department of Safety and Inspections will be recommending the following conditions: 1) The variance shall be for the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 11:59 p.m., with a pre-event sound check at 2:00 p.m. for the St Patrick's Day Event on Saturday, March 17, 2018. 2) All electronically powered equipment used in conjunction with the event shall not exceed 95 dBA as measured at 50 feet from all sound sources outside of the fully enclosed tent from 3:00 p.m. until 11:59 p.m. 3) The applicant shall provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with the sound level variance conditions. 4) All electronically powered equipment, PA systems, loudspeakers or similar devices shall be turned off no later than 11:59 p.m. on March 17, 2018.
