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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Sound Level Variance Insituform Sewer Lining Projects 2018

Dear St. Paul Property Owner:

This is to inform you of a request for a variance from the sound level limitations as indicated in the St. Paul Noise Ordinance (Chapter 293 of the St. Paul Legislative Code). Property owned by you and located near the noise source, may be affected by this variance request. <u>Rental property owners must provide a copy of this notice to all renters or post a copy in a common area of the building so it can be viewed by the occupants.</u>

Description of Variance:

Locations: Ramsey Street from Summit Avenue to Grand Avenue; Dale Street from Laurel Avenue to Dayton Avenue; Grand Avenue from Fairview Avenue to Wheeler Street; Snelling Avenue from Grand Avenue to Summit Avenue; Summit Avenue from Albert Street to Hamline Avenue; Selby Avenue from Fairview Avenue to Wheeler Street; Cretin Avenue from Randolph Avenue to Palace Avenue; and Brewster Street and Pascal Street 850 feet to the East Noise Source: Insituform has applied for eight (8) sound level variances, at various locations for rehabilitation of deteriorated and corroded damage to the sewer pipe. Work is to take place on: Ramsey Street from Summit Avenue to Grand Avenue; Dale Street from Laurel Avenue to Dayton Avenue; Grand Avenue from Fairview Avenue to Wheeler Street; Snelling Avenue from Grand Avenue to Summit Avenue; Summit Avenue from Albert Street to Hamline Avenue; Selby Avenue from Fairview Avenue to Wheeler Street; Cretin Avenue from Randolph Avenue to Palace Avenue; and Brewster Street and Pascal Street 850 feet to the East The project allows elevated sound levels during two, twelve (12) hour processes, 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m., between April 5th and December 31st, 2018 at each of the eight sewer pipe rehabilitation sites. Applicant indicates the site set up to occur from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., with use of equipment with back up alarms and hand held power tools. From 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. of the following day, the only equipment to be used will be critically silenced pumps and truck mounted boiler, not to exceed 70 decibels (dBA) at 50 feet. DSI also recommends that Insituform provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with the variance conditions. Contractors working on the project to use best practicable methods for controlling noise, such as, but not limited to noise blankets, shields or portable sound barriers. Construction activities should be scheduled to minimize noise as much as possible in the late night and early morning hours.
