We won't be digging up the recently reconstructed streets in your neighborhood.

Yes, in 2011, Palace was reconstructed between Fairview and Wheeler as part of the Davern / Jefferson Phase II project. This project involved the reconstruction of sanitary sewer services, water services, water main, and storm drains. The mainline sanitary sewer main in the center of the roadway wasn't replaced on this project. The mainline sanitary was inspected before the street reconstruction project. Based on review of the sewer inspection data, we determined that lining could be done successfully without excavation at a later date.

Yes, the sewer rehab work on your street will last one day. The process of lining a sanitary sewer involves cleaning the sewer and then constructing a sewer liner. The sewer cleaning work on your street has already been completed. The sewer liner installation process will take 1-day. Insituform, the Contractor, has applied for a sound level variance requesting on your street because it is anticipated that the installation of the sewer liner will require up to 24-hrs. of continuous work.

Sewer liner construction is done by:

- Inserting resin saturated felt tube made of polyester through existing manholes.
- The resin in the felt tub is cured by a boiler that circulates hot water.
- The sewer liner creates a new long-lasting pipe within the old sewer.

• Connections to private sewer services are restored by the use of a robotic cutter.
Insituform will coordinate their efforts with property owners and the City, by providing:
• The City with 3-week Look-Ahead schedule every week.

o A notice of sewer lining work one week in advance.
o A notice of sewer lining work one day in advance.
