Subject: Sound Level Variance: Dale Street

Dear Barbara McMonigal-St.Dennis,

I write regarding the Notice on the Sound Level Variance for the Sewer Lining Project on Dale Street from Laurel to Dayton Avenue. I live on the corner of Dale Street and Dayton Avenue and will be deeply impacted by the sound variance.

While I appreciate the need to provide maintenance for sewer pipes, I am very concerned by the extensive time frame of the Notice: the work will occur over a period of TEN months during TWELVE hour periods from 7 pm to 7 am, over a stretch of two city blocks. Certainly, city residents CANNOT imagine TEN months without decent sleep.

So, I have two questions: 1) Are we to assume the work will be done continuously for this time period, or will the work be apportioned for each segment of the two blocks? 2) Will residents, then, along these streets receive advance notice of the timing? Otherwise, how can we possibly prepare for such disturbances—and for such an extended time frame?
